## **President's Report**



Welcome to all Hastings U3A members, especially the many new members enrolled this year for the first time. Thank you for choosing our organization, I hope you gain from your involvement with us and enjoy your chosen subjects and the company of your class mates. Many of you successfully enrolled online which probably explains why our office based support team often had time on their hands. Nevertheless the whole exercise went well and many of our courses were full by the start of term. Next year we will reduce the office support provided and rely more on online enrolment.

To my absolute pleasure many of our new subjects shot off like a rocket. Pickleball in particular filled up very quickly as did both art groups. Many other groups enjoyed a growth in numbers and have few places left. When you realise that last year we took a bit of a risk by changing the fee structure it was absolutely imperative that we attracted sufficient numbers to achieve enough income to meet our outgoings. I am very pleased to say that we have. Most of our members have expressed satisfaction with the new fee structure and all of our tutors are overjoyed that they no longer have to collect cash, balance it, and take it to the office. Cash caused some difficulties coming in every day as it did, now we still have to handle some but that is only in the office. The majority of payments were by EFTPOS machine so perhaps cash will be used less frequently in the future. The larger Banks are already foreshadowing the demise of cash so perhaps there become a time when all of our members prefer to pay by credit/debit card.

Our organization is becoming increasingly dependent on modern technology. Our online membership system, accepting payment by Bank transfers and EFTPOS and communication via group emails and our Website. We need volunteers who are interested in these tools and can help us manage them. You may think of Hastings U3A as a small club but keeping it running requires management and careful co-ordination and relies on modern technology. Please if you feel that you would like to be part of this team of volunteers do not hesitate to speak to a tutor or one of the committee. We need volunteers to share the load and share their skills in the running of this valuable local organization Hastings U3A.

Finally let me provide an update on our meetings with the Shire. In November 2023 we were informed that our temporary office location Hastings Community Hall is in a need of a major roof repair. We have been shown two alternative locations and have informed the Shire of our preferred location. We have been waiting since November for the Shire to confirm the arrangements. Obviously the thought of moving offices again fills me and the rest of our volunteers with dread but there is no doubt that the Hall roof leaks and so move we must. Lets hope we get a date quite soon-before the autumn and winter rains damage our office equipment.

#### 'ANTARCTICA - WORK. REST AND PLAY'

Thursday 14th March at 2 pm - Hastings Hall Followed by Afternoon Tea

Edwina will share with us her experiences from her voyages to Antarctica. Her presentation &quote Antarctica – work, rest, and play and will reveal an insight into life at the three Australian Antarctic research stations. Following her passion for the marine environment from a young age, Edwina completed a degree in environmental science with a major in marine biology, followed by a science research Honours degree in Antarctic science. Edwina also has research experience ranging from working with sea turtles in tropical Australia and the Galapagos Islands, as well as multiple research voyages to Antarctica, working on projects with Adélie penguins and Antarctic krill. She also returned to the Antarctic as a wildlife guide aboard a cruise ship, accompanying tourists to the Falkland Islands, South Georgia, and the Antarctic Peninsula. Edwina has since worked in various science communication and media roles including organizations such as CSIRO, as well as organizations in Asia and Europe.

#### FULL CLASSES AND WAITING LISTS

For the first time ever, quite a number of our classes are already full. It is great that we are becoming more popular, but it can also be challenging for those who want to undertake a particular class and find that they can't get in.

We are doing what we can to provide more places in our most popular classes. We are increasing maximum numbers for some courses and organising to run repeat classes of some of our shorter courses. Over the next couple of weeks we will work with tutors to review attendances in full classes, and remove any enrolments where the member has not attended for three or more consecutive classes and has not advised the tutor of the reason for the absence. This will hopefully free up more places for those waiting to get into courses.

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# So what should you do if you want to get into a class that is already full?

The first thing that you should do is enrol now for that course, either online or by attending the office on a Monday, Wednesday or Friday morning. You will then receive a message saying you have been "Waitlisted" for that course.

If you have not already paid an annual membership fee to undertake other courses, do not pay any fees owing at this stage. We will only ask you to pay a membership fee once you have been given a place in the course you are waiting on.

If and when a place becomes available in the course you are waiting on, these places will be allocated first to those on the waiting list, based on the date order in which they enrolled. If you are offered a place in the course, you will be sent an email to that effect and your enrollment in our system will be changed for you from "Waitlist" to "Enrolled".

Do not attend a course that you are "Waitlisted" for until such time as you are notified that you have been moved from the Waitlist and into the class proper.

If we decide to run a repeat of a short course, we will offer anyone still on the waiting list for the original course the first places in the repeat course.

So don't despair - we are doing what we can to get as many people as we can into the classes they want.

### **OUR MEMBERS 2024**



We now have 291 members enrolled for 2024 – and  $\overline{68}$  of these are brand-new members. Gender

Of the 281 enrolled, 210 are female and 71 are male -3 women to every man!! We need more men to join our ranks, so if you have partners or friends who might be interested, do encourage them to come along.
